

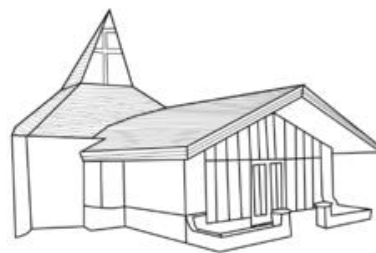

Just One Thing: This year, could your garden be even more wildlife friendly? Here are 3 key ideas from [Essex Wildlife Trust](https://www.essexwildlifetrust.org.uk/): Leave part of the lawn uncut so wildflowers can bloom and set seed. 10-15% of the garden left a little more 'wild' makes a massive difference! Dead wood? Stumps, branches, undisturbed woodpiles are home to hundreds of creatures!
